





City: An area of importance where many people live with a large shopping area and where there are lots of things to see and do).





Moving Minibeasts



Design

- I can design a moving minibeast picture to include a variety of moving mechanisms (slide and spin).
- I know what a pivot is (a pin which turns something).
- I know what a lever is (a bar used to move something).

Make
