Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope that you and all your family are keeping well.

Following the Prime Minister's announcement we are pleased to inform you that the school will **re-open** fully for all pupils on **Monday 8th March**. We want to reassure you that the health, well-being and safety of your children will always be our first priority and we are unapologetic in our commitment to this. The government's guidance is based on a twin strategy of limiting contact between pupils and implementing hygiene measures.

In this letter, we will be outlining the proposed main changes to our normal routines which we have identified as part of our risk assessment. **It is important to note that from 8th March the usual attendance rules will apply and attendance will once again be mandatory.**

Staggered start and finish times

Children will be allocated a start and finish time for their year group. It is very important that they stick to this time and that social distancing is maintained around the school gate. Only one parent should bring/collect their children to/from the school. Parents are kindly requested to wear face coverings when bringing and collecting their children.

Squirrel Lodge, Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils will be met at the gates by staff and taken to their classrooms. Staff on the gates will direct Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 to follow the clearly marked signs to their classroom doors where they will be met by staff.

Class Bubbles

In Years 1 through to Year 6 each class will operate as a teaching bubble as per the DfE guidelines and will remain in the same classroom with the same staff as far as possible. For Nursery and Reception where the classroom environments are more open and learning areas and equipment are shared across classes these will operate as a year group bubbles with a Nursery bubble and a Reception bubble.



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The guidance advises that social distancing and bubbles should not be seen as alternative options and that both measures 'will help'. However, it does recognise that strict social distancing will not always be possible, especially with primary aged pupils. Older children will be encouraged to maintain social distancing but the guidance states that this is not essential. School staff will role model social distancing within their bubble as much as possible, but will still support and comfort children as and when required and administer first aid when the need arises.

School will provide children with pens, pencils, colouring pens, however children will not be able to share equipment. Individual packs of equipment have been put together for each child to keep on their desk with their name on. Children should limit the number of belongings which they bring in to school to lunchboxes, water bottles and coats. All items should be clearly named. Any personal items including their own books from home or pencil cases should be left at home.

Whole school assemblies will be pre-recorded and shared via the interactive whiteboards in classrooms to avoid the need for a large gathering of children in the school hall.

Uniform

Children will be expected to return to school in full school uniform. Uniform can be purchased from Super Sport Uniform Shop, High Street, Tunstall, ST6 5TT.

Cleaning

Classroom staff will have access to appropriate cleaning materials in the classroom. High touch points such as light switches will be cleaned more frequently than usual and doors will be wedged open where possible to limit the amount of 'high touch' surfaces.

Handwashing and hygiene

Regular handwashing/sanitising rotas will be in place for class bubbles. The children will wash/sanitise their hands when coming into school, before eating, after using the bathroom, before leaving school and regularly during the school day. Children will be regularly reminded about the importance of maintaining good hygiene such as covering the mouth when coughing and sneezing e.g 'Catch it, bin it, kill it'.

Break times and Lunchtimes

Children will remain in their class bubbles for break times and lunchtimes. These times will be staggered to ensure that class bubbles have enough space to play without any mixing between bubbles. We will utilise the different outside areas to keep groups apart and create zones for bubbles to play in.

Years 1 to 6 will have their lunches delivered to classrooms and will eat at desks. Nursery will eat in the hall and Reception will eat in the sports hall. Midday supervisors will supervise the same class bubble each day. Lunches from the school kitchen will be served in takeaway boxes and the menu is available to view on our school website.

P.E Kits

All P.E kits must remain at home. PE Days are as follows:

Monday - Y2 & Y6

Tuesday – Y3 & Y5

Thursday – Nursery & Reception

On this day your child should come to school wearing their P.E kit. The children will not need their uniform at all on this day.

Communication with Parents

We will continue to communicate via our text messaging service, email through the Arbor app, the school website, and through Class dojo if parents have individual enquiries. We recommend that parents communicate via email or by telephoning the school office whenever possible rather than sending letters or notes into school. Electronic communication is safest by far.

School Site

Our school foyer is not designed for social distancing and we ask that parents email where possible or telephone when email is not an option. To ensure the safety of all we will not be allowing parents on to the school site at the present time. If you need to collect your child during the school day this should be done by prior arrangement with the school office staff. Your child will be escorted to the gate by a member of staff for collection by a parent.

Face masks

The guidance regarding face masks for primary age pupils still states that these are not required to be worn within the school site, therefore please do not send your child to school with a face mask. School staff will wear face masks or face shields at all times and we strongly urge any adult who is attending the school site to drop off or collect a child also wears a face mask.

Before and After school provision

Before and After school care club will re-open fully. The before and after school provision may be accessed by all pupils from Nursery up to Year 6. Parents wishing to book a place for their child must do so via an online booking system. A link will be sent each Thursday to book for the following week. Bookings must be made before 1pm on the day, if there are no bookings, the after school club will not run. All sessions will incur a charge and payments must be made through the Arbor app, if payments are not made your child may be stopped from attending. The government guidance recognises that it may not be possible for schools to provide before and after school care whilst operating in class bubbles. Instead we will operate the provision in small consistent groupings and with social distancing.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they should not attend school and should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test> or by calling 119 .

All other household members who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for 10 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'. The 10-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill. Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home. If you require help with buying groceries, other shopping or picking up medication, or walking a dog, you should ask friends or family. Alternatively, you can order your shopping online and medication by phone or online.



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Any children isolating at home who are fit and well can continue to access remote learning via Class Dojo.

Symptoms of COVID 19

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature and/or
- a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

If a child should develop or display symptoms whilst at school, we will contact parents / carers to come and collect the pupil immediately so that a test can be booked.

All staff are participating in twice weekly lateral flow testing to aid early detection of any positive cases and to reduce the risk of transmission of the virus.

As you can see, there are many aspects that we have had to consider when thinking about re-opening fully. There will no doubt have to be modifications to these plans as we see how they work in practice.

Please can I re-iterate once again that we can only minimise the risk, we cannot eliminate it completely.
